Paraeducator Proficiency Examination

The EGUSD Paraeducator Proficiency exam is offered on a regular basis. The two-part multiple-choice exam covers math and English skills. The test can take up to three hours to complete. Education, Child Development and Family Services Pathway



Paraeducator Training Certificate

With the movement towards more inclusive classrooms, paraeducators provide day-to-day support for students with special needs. Paraeducators play a valuable role in meeting student's needs.

Topic covered:

- The Roles and Responsibilities of Paraeducators
- Introduction to Early Childhood Education
- Mandated Reporter
- Working with English Language Learners
- Behavior Intervention & Classroom management

February 13 - May 9 (12 weeks)

Tuesdays/Thursdays 5:30-8:30 pm (in-person)

Paraeducator IELCE (Integrated English Literacy and Civic Education)

This course allows English language learners an opportunity to focus on vocabulary development, reading, writing and communication skills that a Paraeducator will use in the field. This class is coordinated with the material used in the Paraeducator Training class to accelerate understanding for English language learners.

This 15-week course has 2 hours of in-person instruction and 1 hour of distance learning per week.

January 23 - May 9

Tuesdays/Thursdays 4:15-5:15 pm

Introduction to Early Childhood Education (ECE)

This course will prepare you to enter ECE college courses and introduce you to immediate employment opportunities. This introductory course covers early childhood education, including an overview of the history of the field, evolution of professional practices and ethics, educational principles that support child development from birth through the school-age years, and teaching practices based on observation, documentation, and interpretation of children's behavior.

This 12-week course has 4 hours in-person instruction and 2 hours of distance learning per week.

January 24 - April 17

Wednesdays 4:30-8:30 pm (In-person)

Early Childhood Education IELCE (Integrated English Literacy and Civic Education)

This course allows English language learners an opportunity to focus on vocabulary development, reading, writing and communication skills that an Early Childhood Educator will use in the field. This class is coordinated with the material in the introduction to ECE class to accelerate progress for English language learners.

This 12-week course has 1.5 hours of in-person instruction and 1.5 hours of distance learning per week.

Start your own business or add to your current business working as a Notary Public. As a public servant commissioned by the Secretary of State, the Notary Public protects the integrity of legal and personal documents. This course will teach you everything you need to know to pass the state notary exam and be a successful Notary Public: Must be a California resident, complete this course, pass a notary exam and pass a background check. Instructor: California Notary Training Center

Make Money as a Loan Signing Agent

Take your income to the next level as a Certified Loan Signing Agent. Loan Signing Agents are notaries who facilitate obtaining signatures for real estate purchases and loans, and typically make \$75-\$150 per loan signing. If you have taken the notary public course, take this course and be ready to go once you get your notary commission. Certification involves an "open book" online exam taken after the class and a background check. Associated costs for certification and supplies will be explained in the class. First Aid/CPR/AED – Adult & Pediatric

This class offerings interactive scenarios and hands-on skill practice. Topics covered: Sudden cardiac arrest, CPR, Using an AED, Choking, Shock, Stroke, Poisoning, Altered mental status, Head, neck and back injuries, and Burns. Medical Assistant

22-week program/856 hours

Jan 16 - June 28, 2024, M-F 7 am-3:30 pm

This program prepares students to work in the medical profession. Students will train to assist physicians by performing functions related to the clinical responsibilities of a medical office such as Phlebotomy, Pharmacology and diet. They will also learn the proper use and administration of medications, taking and documenting vital signs, cardiology including proper lead placements, professional workplace behavior, ethics and the legal aspects of healthcare and HIPPA. Students will complete their First Aid/CPR/BLS training and prepare for the NCCT Certification exam.

Program fee:

The \$5,000 fee includes all textbooks, materials, a set of scrubs, immunization, one NCCT MA Certificate exam, and First Aid and CPR/BLS training.



Billing and Coding Specialist

7-week program, 112 hours

Hybrid (28 hours class/84 hours online)

Feb 6 - March 28, 2024 T/Th 6:30-8:30 p.m.

April 6 - May 18, 2024, Sat 9 am-1 pm

This program prepares students to work in the medical profession. Students will learn how to prepare billing invoices for services rendered, compile computer and record billings, assign diagnosis and procedure codes, protect the security of medical records, retrieve patient medical records for physicians, enter computer data such as demographic characteristics, and HIPPA. Students will prepare for the NCCT/ICS certification exam.

Program fee:

The \$2,500 fee includes all textbooks, materials, a set of scrubs, and one NCCT/ICS Certificate exam.

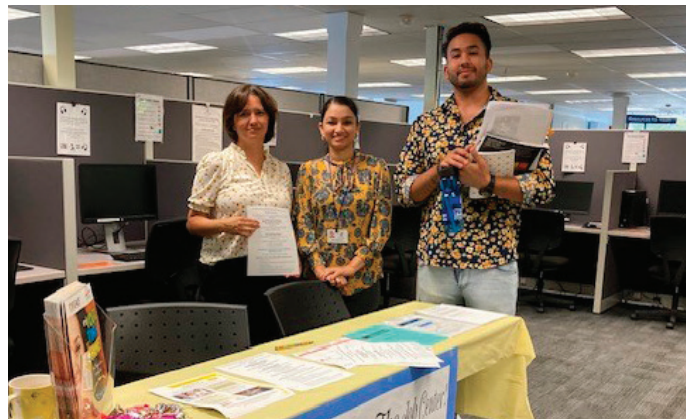

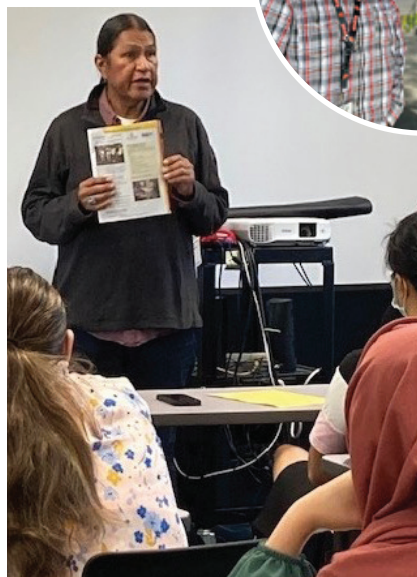

The High School Diploma Program is designed for adult students to earn the necessary credits to earn their High School Diploma. Your teacher will help you develop an Individualized Learning Plan, set goals, and provide learning support as you work at your pace to complete the credits. Students can access course materials via a Learning Management System anywhere there is internet access.

Tu-Th: 4:30-8:30 pm

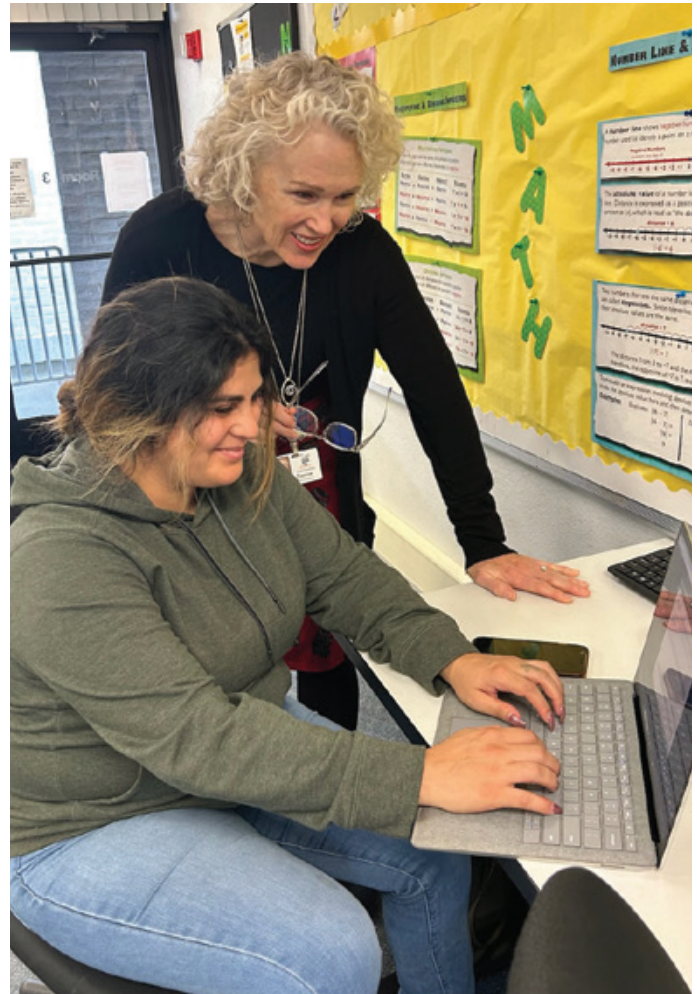
Students are scheduled in a class based on their availability (when they plan to do class work). Students are required to meet a minimum of one time per week with their teacher; in person or via Zoom.

On campus, students have access to computers, materials, and individualized instruction. Upon completion of EGUSD graduation requirements, students will receive a California high school diploma.

A high school diploma is an important step on the journey to success. It can provide a foundation for future learning and help prepare students for the challenges of life after high school.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the median usual weekly earnings for adults age 25 and over that lack a high school diploma is \$493, compared to \$678, for workers who have a diploma.

A state-issued GED diploma gives you access to more jobs, advanced workplace training, and higher education. It's accepted as an equivalent to a high school diploma by about 97% of colleges and universities in the U.S. and 95% of employers, including the military, the government, and police departments.



Adult Basic Education

Improve your Skills! Basic English and Basic Math classes are for adults who want to improve their skills for training program assessments or to transition to academic program. Students access study materials using online coursework and may work on or off campus.

English as a Second Language (ESL) classes are open and free to all persons 18 year of age and older.

Burlington English Distance Learning (BEDL)

Burlington English is a Web-based English speech recognition program. Students will improve their pronunciation, increase their vocabulary, learn grammar, and practice their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. Students can learn and practice English wherever they can log onto a computer. Students communicate with the teacher by email. This course is best suited for students with a beginning high to advanced English level who are comfortable using a computer.



ESL Academic Applications Classes are designed to build academic reading and writing skills to reinforce ESL and transfer to career training or college.

Citizenship Classes Available

Fridays 9 am – Noon

Preparation for the U.S. naturalization interview and examination. Overview of American history and government, geography, and the duties and rights of citizenship. Study of basic written and spoken English in a context specific to the naturalization application, interview, and civics questions. This class is for students of all English levels who are eligible to become U.S. Citizens.

This ESL basic grammar course will provide an introduction into the foundations of English grammar with topics covering parts of speech, sentence structure, simple and progressive verb tenses, and writing basics. This class is for students with a beginning to intermediate English level.

Grammar and Writing II

Mon/Wed 12:15-1:45 pm

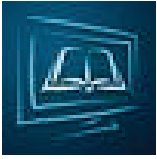
